## Parish Council & Village News - August & September 2024

**20 MPH zone in the centre of Chelveston:** Thank you to everyone who responded to the local consultation during July.

At the parish level, over a third of the electorate and households responded, and at the Chelveston only level, just over 40% responded, both with just under 90% supporting the proposal. (For comparison, the Northants Police Fire & Crime Commissioner was elected in May with 39% supporting on 39% turnout).

Some of the objection responses were concerned that Water Lane might be used as a "cut through" to avoid the 20 mph restrictions. The Cllrs agreed that this was a valid concern and wish to work with Northants Highways to make Water Lane a less attractive option. This will be guided by what Highways will permit.

**Allotment shed replacement:** The 12 new sheds have now been installed by local handyman, Alistair Mead. All 16 sheds have now been replaced in the last 18 months by grant funding.

**Star & Garter:** The Star & Garter closed on Sun 18<sup>th</sup> August, whilst Charles Wells seeks a new licensee to take over the running of the pub.

**Community Speed Watch:** The CSW equipment will be in the parish from 17<sup>th</sup> August to 14<sup>th</sup> September, helping to deter speeding traffic. If you want to join our CSW team, please contact the Clerk who will put you in touch with Cllr Hill who leads the CSW team.

Once trained, you are covered by Northants Police insurance whilst using the CSW cameras.

Speed Indicator Device the "SID Solar" project: The Raunds Road and Water Lane SIDs have just been converted to solar power, and the Caldecott SID is now mains powered (from the lamppost it is mounted on). This should mean the SIDs will be operational more of the time, and not reliant on volunteers having to lift up and swap the heavy battery units every fortnight.

Items for reuse: As a result of the above, we now have six Numax Leisure LV22MF 12v 75Ah batteries and three Suaoki ICS4+ 6/12v 4A battery chargers, all purchased in 2011, surplus to requirements. Leisure batteries are not car batteries (despite looking the same), as they provide a lower level of energy over a much longer time. They are used in caravans, narrowboats, motorhomes, etc. We can recycle them, but re-use is even better.

So if you would like one (or more) of these, please contact the Clerk. Any still remaining by 30<sup>th</sup> September will be recycled.

Chelveston Village Hall: is independently owned and operated by one of the parish charities, the Educational Foundation of Abigail Bailey and Ann Levett, founded in 1760. In the last newsletter we reported that most of the existing volunteers would be standing down by June 2025 at the latest. Between them, they will have completed over 80 years of service.

A call for new volunteers has been unsuccessful, and there was a real prospect that the venue would need to close. However, it is still a viable operation and is used for over 20 hours per week. The Parish Council has been asked if it would be prepared to step in and run the Village Hall directly on behalf of residents.

The Council met in August and agreed that the Village Hall and paddock are still important village assets which must be maintained. The Council has therefore decided to take on the role of the 'Sole Trustee' at the earliest opportunity.

Given the challenges of getting volunteers to manage the day to day operations, a new part-time paid role of Village Hall Manager will be created. To achieve this, the charity will be converted to a Charitable Incorporated Organisation, enabling it to enter into employment contracts.

Work will begin immediately to ensure a smooth handover of responsibilities from the existing volunteers

**Chelveston Village Hall:** The Village Hall will be closed from Weds 21<sup>st</sup> to Sat 31<sup>st</sup> August for planned maintenance work on the ceiling.

**Environment Team:** Strawberry Hill at Knotting Green is an extraordinary place, just a few minutes' drive from Chelveston and Caldecott. Some 35 years ago, the previous owner decided to let nature take over this 150 hectare (377 acre) site. The land was transformed from poor arable fields to grassland, shrub and young woodland. As the habitat became wilder, the wildlife moved in — nightingales, turtle doves, linnets, harvest mice, badgers and more.
