Parish Council & Village News - February & March 2022

Defibrillators: The first defibrillator and cabinet have been ordered, and the Council has signed a wayleave agreement with the brewery to allow it to be placed on the wall of the *Star & Garter*.

Training sessions – whilst public access defibrillators are designed to be used without training, we recognise that for many people using one for the first time will be daunting. Accordingly, as part of the project, the Council are providing free training sessions in the Village Hall in Spring.

The two hour sessions will be run on Saturday afternoons, by the East Northants First Responders, with a maximum of 20 persons in each session. Either email or write to the Clerk (*contact details over the page*) to register and you will be contacted nearer the time with available dates.

Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) review – The Council's grant application to Locality to fund a planning consultant to review the adopted NDP was successful and Troy Design & Planning have been appointed (they are familiar with the area, as they are currently working on the Rushden NDP).

They will assess the planning applications made since the NDP was made in 2017 and advise on how effective it has been in delivering its objectives. Then they will assess the changes in legislation and the Local Plans (NNC) and suggest what changes the parish might wish to adopt to strengthen the NDP.

Their work is to be completed by the end of February, and will be used to guide a local NDP Working Party review later this year.

Council budget and Precept – At the January meeting, the Council voted to approve the budget for FY22-23 and set the Precept (part of the Council Tax) at £11,700, an increase of £500 (4.46%).

However there are now an extra 7 households in the parish paying Council Tax, so the actual impact on a Band D property is 62p (about 1.2p a week).

As part of the Budget proposals, the Council is increasing the amount it spends on grass cutting, this being the biggest source of complaints in 2021, though this will be partly offset by the savings from the LED lighting system installed in 2021.

New grass cutting contractor – The 2022 grass contract has been awarded to Mowerman Grounds Maintenance, who already cuts the Chelston Rise grass for the Estate Management Company.

The 2022 cutting season has been extended, and with additional cuts during the peak growing period of March and April.



The Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebration event. This will take place on Thurs 2nd – Sun 5th June. Locally various ideas have been proposed –

- Lighting a beacon on Thurs 2nd June as part of the international QPJ beacons (the amenity area at Chelston Rise has been suggested, being the highest residential area of the parish).
- A service of celebration at the Church.
- Holding a Big Jubilee Lunch in the Village Hall paddock (avoids having to close any roads).
- Planting a tree (as part of the QPJ Green Canopy project).
- Events at the Star & Garter.
- A family treasure hunt.

The Council is open to suggestions for other events, and can get grants to help fund these, but what we really need are volunteers to help put these ideas into practice.

Parish flagpole – During the first Covid lockdown, many of you made donations, such as for the tulip competition, for parcels delivered by Adrian's red van, or for the scarecrow competition.

There have been several suggestions that the parish should have a flagpole, to mark events such as the QPJ, the 100th anniversary of the WI, the 80th anniversary of the USAAF arriving at RAF Chelveston (all in 2022), etc.

Accordingly, the donations will part fund the first parish flagpole, to be erected outside the Village Hall, next to the noticeboard.

Council Meetings - The Council was successful in getting a grant from the Foulger Trust to part fund additional microphones for the Council meetings, so as to make it easier for the public to hear all the Councillors (and any public speakers), especially if the heaters and air scrubbers are in operation.
