## Chelveston-cum-Caldecott News

### Parish Council & Village News – August & September 2023

A new Councillor – following the recent vacancy, the Council considered two candidates who had offered themselves for co-option. The new Cllr is Claire Warsop from Caldecott, who will serve alongside the other Cllrs until the next ordinary elections in May 2025.

**Parking issues** – residents are reporting instances of inconsiderate parking in Water Lane, near and opposite the junction with Sawyers Crescent, where vehicles have parked on the pavements or footways, making it difficult for pedestrians.

The defibrillator at the *Star & Garter* also suffers from inconsiderate parking, despite a polite notice asking drivers not to park in front of the cabinet. Accordingly the Parish Council is now looking at installing a flower planter to keep the access clear.

The defibrillator intended for Chelston Rise is waiting for the developer to install an electrical supply (at their expense).

**Street Lamp 22**, adjacent to *The Cottage*, Chelveston and 1 Water Lane, is still waiting for Telent (Openreach's contractor) to sort out a date with National Grid to temporarily make safe and remove the power cable before they can replace the BT pole. This was originally all supposed to have happened in April, but keeps getting delayed.

**Bidwell Lane HGV signage**. The good news is that Northants Highways have the order ready to go for installing permanent signs on B645 either side of the Bidwell Lane junction. Unfortunately, they haven't yet worked out the legalities of installing new signage in the NNC area.

Northamptonshire Fire and Rescue Service (NFRS) is recruiting apprentice, full-time firefighters and is asking people from every community across Northamptonshire if they have got what it takes to join the county's firefighters.

If you live in Northants and are interested in applying, the recruitment portal is open until midday on **Monday 14<sup>th</sup> August**.

To be a trainee full-time firefighter, you must:

- live in Northants
- have a full car driving licence valid for the UK (with no more than 3 points)
- be able to permanently live and work in the UK without any restrictions
- be aged 18 years old at the start of the application process

Community Minibus (CommMiniBus) is a community transport service dedicated to enhancing transportation options for residents in North Northants. They have received a grant from the NNC to extend their Demand Responsive Transport service to parts of county that don't have an existing bus service. Possible destinations might be Rushden Lakes, Wellingborough, Kettering, etc.

Holders of concessionary bus passes are eligible for free off peak travel, whilst a mileage based fare applies to other passengers.

The Parish Council has been asked to identify what demand there is for such a service locally. If this is something you would use, please complete the accompanying flyer and drop off the completed form to your nearest Cllr (addresses over) by 31<sup>st</sup> August.

The allotment sheds are 13 years old now and some are reaching end of life. The Council has agreed to replace the sheds over three years, and so all the sheds have been assessed as to their priority for replacement.

The sheds were originally gifted to the Council by a (then) Cllr to avoid any impact on the public funds (the allotments operate on a neutral budget for the same reason). Accordingly the Council is intending to replace the sheds through grant funding, to avoid any impact on the Precept (local tax).

**Annual Audit.** As the Council is spending public money, in part through local taxation, so it is subject to internal and external audit. The external auditor is set nationally for the county, but the internal auditor is appointed by the Council.

For the last couple of decades, this role has been carried out by residents and ex-residents who were qualified bookkeepers or accountants. However this approach only focused on the finances, not how the Council operated in regard to risk and governance.

As the Council has more income and expenditure than it did 20 years ago, so the Cllrs decided it was time to move to a more professional approach, and so the FY2022-23 accounts have been audited by the Northants CALC Internal Audit Service, which audits over 170 of the 220 Town & Parish Councils in Northants.

The Council is pleased to report we only received two recommendations (one of which is for our accounting software provider). Now we await the results of the external audit!
